CHILDRENS RELIEF - A forgotten group

Dicănesti is a Roma (gypsy) village near Oradea (Romania). Thirty Roma families live here in extreme poverty. They are a forgotten group. Nobody looks after them.

Most of them have never been to school. They struggle to communicate, which makes it impossible for them to find work.

The nearest school is a few miles outside the village. When it rains the bridge that connects the village with the rest of the world is flooded. This makes it impossible for the children to go to school.

Mirela has been very touched by the situation. The Lord laid on her heart a desire to educate the children in Dicănesti. In the summer she started a summer school school for them. She was

shocked by how under-developed they were. Many did not know how to hold a pencil, or how to draw a tree or a flower, but they were very motivated to learn. For them it is a great joy to be able to go to school.

A summer school seems like a drop in the ocean, however it brings great joy into the lives of these children. After the summer Mirela has continued to visit Dicanesti at the weekends to teach the children.

What a privilege that God had given us this little girl to care for! It is incredible to realise that God looks at us in the same way as we look at our baby girl. The Creator of our universe, the Alpha and Omega, loves us. He loves us even more than we could ever love our children.

In a broken world love is often missing. One of the most uncomfortable places I have ever been to, was an orphanage I visited on my first trip to Romania in 2001. We went there to meet another team who were doing a renovation project in the orphanage.

This orphanage was a place where all love had gone, it was extreme chaos. Children were constantly abusing each other, it was hell on earth. I was very relieved to leave that place after just a few hours, to go back to the orphanage where our team were doing the renovation project. Not all orphanages in Romania are as bad as the one in Tirgu Mures.

Love is essential for a human-being to function. When love is absent things go wrong, very wrong. This also means that when people feel loved and appreciated, situations change for the better.

This is one of our core values when going out into the mission-field, to love and care for people.

We are not always able to solve the problems of the people we meet. However, we can encourage them, spend time with them, appreciate them and tell them about God's love for them.

In the next few weeks, teams will go out to Albania and Romania. These are people who are motivated to encourage Christian Brothers and Sisters abroad.

We will never fully comprehend God's love for us, the closest example will be our love for our children. We are made in God's image; ask Him how to love and appreciate others. He knows best!

Arab Spring and mbb Mosab Hassan Yousef

What is an 'mbb' ? This means 'a Muslim background Believer'. This stands for someone who was born and educated as a Muslim, who now becomes a Christian.

The 'mbb' in our title gave his life to Christ 10 years ago in Ramallah, Jerusalem. He wrote a book under the title "Son of Hamas" in 2008. Last summer he appeared openly in Jerusalem and spoke on many Arabic TV news programs as well as CNN (17-9-2012). He told about his conversion, but also that he worked a long time as a

double agent for Hamas, as well as for the Israelis, saving many Arabic and Jewish lives. He came to realise Israel serves an honorable and real moral issue, and Hamas and the PA are only acting criminally, slaughtering and oppressing their own people. He was in the middle of a war between 'the god of Islam and the God of Torah'. In his work with Israeli Security Services he met Christians in Ramallah and soon understood that only the Prince of Peace, Jesus, offers the peace that Jews, Arabs and all people need.

The Israelis allowed him to leave their operations and live for a while under cover in the USA. Mbb Christians are always in a very vulnerable position as traditional Christians in the Middle East will not, and cannot, help them at all. They are the most persecuted Christians in the world. They are always hiding and on the run (even in the free western world sometimes), and only Christian broadcasting gives them safe Christian fellowship. It is significant that this 'son of Hamas' came out into the open after the Arab Spring has brought major changes in the Middle East. He expects, with many others, that the current Islamic power will one day collapse, and Islam will join a worldwide religious alliance initiated by traditional non-born again Christians and led by a person that we will recognize as the Antichrist. How far are we from the return of Jesus?! Let us say and pray together: Yes, Lord lesus, come soon! Amen.

A difficult start

From the bedroom I had a splendid view view of the Albanian mountains. I heard voices coming from the room beneath me. I remembered the miracle of God's provision the day before. It was two days before the end of the Barnabas conference and we needed a large sum to cover the costs of the event. I decided to text a friend who had helped us out on previous occasions.

It became very clear to me through conversations with participants with a Muslim back ground, that before they gave their lives to the Lord, they had a special encounter. An encounter in which the Lord revealed himself

The message was as as follows:

' I am here at the Barnabas conference in Albania. Just like last time we need special provision for a large amount. I have waited until now but from the £8000 we still need £2500 needs to be provided for and there are only 36 hours left to come up with the money. Eighty young people are currently being prepared to reach out to their own communities in this Muslim country.'

During the evening collection my phone beeped. A text: 'My sister has pledged £400 and me too. God's blessings and enjoy your time in Albania

Thankfulness

I received another text while I was interviewing a Muslim background believer. Enthusiastically I told him the good news of God's provision. That evening the organiser of the event came to me with a draft of the final costs of the event. When he told me the amount I just smiled at him and when he finished I told him that the Lord provided the sum that was needed. We were both very relieved and glad.

The sun came up over Pogradec. Around 7.30am many participants gathered in the church building. The morning prayer meetings were very well attended. Instead of having that extra hour of sleep most participants committed themselves to prayer. There is a great desire for revelation from the Lord.

We are important to God. He wants to use us to make His Gospel known to the people around us. The more we are available the more He will use us.

Albano's testimony Albano (24) lives in the city of Erseka near the Greek border in Albania. He grew up in a Muslim family, at the age of 14 he met with Lord. At the Barnabas conference he shared his testimony.

'My parents were part of the Bectashi movement, an Islamic sect. They worship sacred stones and trees. The sect would meet at a 'thesha' (sacred place) on a daily basis. In their worship services they would kiss pieces of rock and sacrifice a lamb.

When I was fourteen I moved to the city of Shkoder to study. My Muslim roommate started to criticise the sect I was part of. From



that moment on I started my quest to find God. My roommate told me that the only way to heaven would be through Islam. I wanted to know what I had to do when I would stand in front of God. He told me to pray five times every day and do good deeds. God would then weigh up the good deeds against the bad deeds. If the balance is positive you would earn your place in heaven. Otherwise hell would be your destiny. I did not really like the prospect of spending eternity in hell.

A little later I met an Albanian Christian, I discovered that I was a sinner and that the Lord would forgive me through Jesus Christ. My friend praved with me. It was my first praver to the God of the Christians. I was filled with joy and had a great desire to learn more about this God.'

Albano went through a very rough time where most of his friends left him. After one year he was allowed to enter Campus Crusade Bible School.

This summer Albano participated in the Barnabas event in Albania. He also is part of the leadership team of a church, the conference really encouraged him in his ministry.
