Cuna family, Albania

The Cuna family is one of the poorest families, but also one of the most grateful, to God and to the sponsors for the blessings they receive through the Children's Sponsorship Plan. In 2020 we helped this family with house repairs so now they have better living conditions. Father Cuna is a very handy man, a blacksmith and a good house painter. Since he is unemployed, we asked what he might be able and willing to do. He wants to work hard for his family, put bread on the table, enable his children to go to school and learn to be useful to the family and society. There are many opportunities for a blacksmith, as this profession was widely practised in Tepelena, where he lives.



Many have left Albania to work in the West, so there is a need for people who can ply this trade. To start the project, an amount of about £2200 is needed, to buy necessary tools and pay three months' rent for a work place. After the start up period he would be able to afford the rent himself. We are eager to help him and hope that other parents who are supported through the CSP in the city of Tepelena, will also be inspired to start something so they can support their own families. Roma work in Ukraine by Viki Antal

One of my biggest tasks, in addition to sharing the Gospel, is to help children in education, especially those in bad situations, from poor families. The Roma children are a big challenge because I work not only with them but also with their parents as they do not see the value of studying. The children come to school without a notebook or a pen, although the parents could receive social money.

Last November, the government decided to stop social money for those Roma families whose children don't go to school. At my school 95% of the pupils are Roma. After this decision, many Roma parents came asking for help to let their children come to our school. From114 pupils, now there are 356, and still growing. Most schools do not want to have them, so our 15-20 classes are now 30-35. Difficult to teach before, now there is utter chaos. Because the children are from poor families they do not know the basics, e.g. how to use the toilet or keep simple hygienic rules. This winter has been cold, but they come to school in a thin jacket or just a sweater. Not to mention the shoes! Mornings are usually -10C to -17C.

Another big problem is that parents should pay for the daily hot food but they don't. I pray God will change their mentality, help them have a better life, integrate in society, get to know Jesus. Let's pray the children will love learning, that the parents see the value of education, and that the teachers can love these children. And last but not least, that we always seek to share the Gospel.

The teachers have been paying out of their small

wages to buy food. EEO's Children's Relief Department want to help Viki's students. CAN WE COUNT ON YOUR HELP AS WELL?
