PAKISTAN NEWS: TERRORIST ATTACK



A few weeks ago in the city of Peshawar in Pakistan two suicide bombers blew themselves up at the entrance of a church, just when churchgoers were leaving the church building. Over 100 Believers were killed by the explosion and even more people were wounded.

In the United Kingdom we are free to go to church. In Pakistan this is different. The Christians (2% of Christians) are under immense pressure. The idea of Freedom of Religion as propagated in the West does not exist in a Muslim society. The two percent Christians have little or no rights.

We have received several requests for prayer for Pakistan from our brothers and sisters in Christ over there.

Christians are under such pressure that their fear is almost tangible. But there is hope. This picture comes from Pakistan. The Mission Schools started 12 years ago with just 16 children in a room of 10 ft. by 13 ft. At the moment 322 children receive Christian education! The mission schools are a blessing for many and a symbol of hope for the future.

Presentations in Your Church: We are currently looking to get more people involved in eastern



If you are able to, sign up for a mission trip! Step out of your boat and walk on the water! You'll never be the same again!

SUMMER CAMPS IN THE ROMANIAN MOUNTAINS



When going camping there is this excitement of living close to nature, experiencing God's beautiful creation.

Each summer Pastor Cristi Frunza from the city of Iaşi organises several youth camps for poor children from the city and surrounding villages.
Following is a report about one of the camps.

The Challenge

The children participating in this camp all come from four villages just outside of Iaşi (north east Romania). The long summer holidays have just begun. School will only commence after three months, and also the harvest time has not yet started.

The children are between 11 and 17 years of age. It looks like one big family. Fortunately most of the children are from large families so it was easy to integrate. Only 5 children came from Christian families; the other children have only recently started going to church or have not been to church for years. For them it was a great challenge to participate in the camp. This resulted in some very special conversations and encounters.

Bible stories

The wooden cabin in the mountains offers space for thirteen children and four leaders. The camp is not only a time of fun but it also gives the opportunity to get to know each other and share the Gospel. We read from the Bible and used visual aids learned at the Barnabas events like a Sketch board and conjuring tricks. Pastor Cristi's son, Tudor, is an expert in using conjuring tricks to explain a message.

The evenings always ended with songs and stories around the campfire. It was an amazing experience for the children.

Promise

On the first day there was a desire from the youngsters to sing together and to listen to stories about the miracles of Jesus. I was stunned to see how quickly these children

learned the songs by heart. Even on the long walks and during the sports activities they were singing the songs they had just learned. Every child that did not have a Bible received a New Testament. They were surprised to find out that the Bible is not a boring big book, but easy to read and to understand. They all promised to read the whole New Testament by the end of the year!

Discover

The parents of Adelina (15) Samuel (14) and Lucian (13) had stopped going to church years ago. They barely knew the Bible and

were not interested in the Gospel. They knew one Christian song and the Lord's Prayer. During the camp they discovered how simple and important it is to communicate with the Lord through prayer. They also found out how nice it is to sing worship songs and how interesting the Word of the Lord is. They promised to visit the local church in their village.

Around the campfire

It is a real blessing to introduce these youngsters to the Gospel while so many of their peers turn away from God. During the camp they started to understand God's purpose and the message of Jesus; they also learned to pray. Bible teachers should actively teach young people the Word of God. Using illustrations and conjuring can be very effective

Around the campfire the youngsters also opened up and asked questions about the things they struggle with in daily life.

We really did our utmost to keep everyone's spirit lifted; one of the ways of doing that is to tell stories with a happy ending at the campfire.

We heard many testimonies from parents who were very impressed with the positive influence the camp has had on their children

Friends for ever

During the camp, friendships were made. The time the youngsters spent together created a special bond. Shy children started to open up during walks through the mountains. When saying their 'goodbyes' many tears flowed. Promises were made to stay in touch

These camps have a profound influence on the lives of these young people.
