- "Why must I leave everything behind me? "


Conditions

Each component of the flowering year blossoms in its due season. But it has to be at the right time; bluebells, lilacs and roses will not flower if the time is not right.

Paul writes, "... this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things", (Ephesians 3:8-9). For just as the Spring flowers were kept hidden in the soil over Winter, so God kept hidden in His heart a secret plan which would flower, bit by bit, in His good time. The most exciting thing about being a Christian is to know that God has such a Plan and we are all part of it! Paul's part was to preach Christ to the Gentiles; something astounding in view of the insularity and elitism of the brand of Orthodox Judaism that Paul was educated in. But, Paul's flowering came in its due season.

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the sun", (Ecclesiastes 3:1). As a young man, I remember our minister talking about the ebb and flow of the Christian faith, how, throughout Church history a season of decline is always followed by revival. I regularly minister in a Christian Care Home. I am happy to tell these older folk about what God is doing today; how, in our area in recent years, seven new churches have been planted, meeting in school halls and community centres, and that cinemas, warehouses, and a redundant school have also become Christian meeting places. God has not abandoned His Church and I was blessed when these faithful soldiers of Christ, who kept the Gospel alive, received this news so joyfully. As we see former church buildings become discount carpet warehouses or, as in one case, a factory for the repair and maintenance of gaming machines, we can thank God that this is not the true story. These new Churches may be quite different from what the older folk experienced; in a new season God has granted a flowering of new kinds of music and new expressions of Church. But one thing that has NOT changed is *the Gospel*. It is the *same* Gospel, the *same* message of Christ and Him crucified, and we preach the same God who "so loved the world that He gave His only Son that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life". Praise His holy name!

'After primary school, I went to high school to learn Musical studies. In my class of twenty students, I am the only Christian. The others are Muslim. Shkoder contains many Muslims. Over 50% of the population is Muslim in Shkoder. Really, there is a world of difference in how I can be here and how I behave at school. Here I can speak about God whenever I want. It's really great to be here at camp Barnabas.'

Young Missionaries testify

Christians have answers to vital questions! *Barnabas* helps give answers to young people's questions. In countries where young Christians are struggling, EEO UK organizes *Barnabas* conferences, then they send the young people out to be a light in a dark world. This year, EEO UK is supporting *Barnabas* operations in Bulgaria and Macedonia. With more resources, we would be able to support conferences in Albania, Israel and Asia. If these *young people* do not go, who is going? If we do not support them, *who will?!*

Lepa is sixteen years old. She loves cycling and kickboxing and tells about her life in her hometown of Veles in Macedonia: "I love to play sports. I play volleyball and my hobby is singing. My father has a gym in Veles. Everyone in Veles knows us. The gym is situated in a school. I am often in the gym and I do training with my father. The town where I live is one of the most criminal cities in Macedonia. It is a small town where everyone knows each other. A lot of people are unemployed. The people in the city trade in drugs; the rest have jobs outside the city. Our neighbours are also into drugs. My parents do not like it when I am alone at night walking on the streets. My city is a dark city. We are here to shine the light there. My father had a vision to be a light for those who live in darkness. I have told my friends about Jesus Christ and that they need Him, but they did not accept Him yet. They accept it from me, but do nothing with it themselves. I do not often see the fruit from my testimony. Sometimes I get disappointed; I lose friends. They want nothing more to do to me since I've become a Christian. My best friend is interested, but she will not stop swearing or using bad language. She wants to be 'free'. She told me recently that she had a hole, a void inside of her. I told her about Jesus and she accepted Him. Then the void disappeared, but that was only temporary, for she remained in her old habits of swearing and bad language. Peace has gone away again. One very good thing happened. Our friend Martin came here to the Barnabas conference. Martin is only seventeen, but was often drunk. Fighting was his hobby. If someone looked at him, he would run towards him and then ask, "Why are you looking at me?!" Then he began to beat them. Martin hit hard because he was at the gym and trained with my father. Now Martin

can still fight, but he does not do that on the street, because he has accepted Jesus into his life. One evening he was released from all evil within him. Now He wants to give the Gospel to his friends. That's his 'new sport'." One evening Lepa wanted to share a prophetic vision she was seeing in a meeting. She saw herself walking into a crowd of people. They all had their heads down but Lepa was looking around and seeing beautiful things. People looked at her and then they also started to look around. In the vision, more people discovered that with God sadness disappears, grey becomes vibrant colour! **Lepa is happy with the promise of God on her life!** For an amount of £50,- you can sponsor one young person to go on a three day encouragement and training conference. This also includes food, accommodation, programme and materials for Evangelism, plus a one to three day evangelistic outreach. You can send a young missionary into the harvest, and encourage young people not to give up, but to be a Light in the Darkness!

Merla comes from a traditional Muslim family. When she was a little girl, she went to the Christian meetings in the village. She was always attending the summer camps that were organized in the community centre. The family was poor and lived in great need and the Mission gave them food. One day they entered into the EEO International's Child Sponsor Programme, so we were able to help them. They were curious about the Gospel, because they saw that we helped without asking anything in return.

Last Summer I asked Merla if she wanted to go to the *Barnabas* Summer conference. She jumped for joy! Then her joy was immediately cut off, for she said: "... You've got to ask my parents if I can go and I don't have any money to pay ..." We were sure that God had a plan for this girl. After we prayed together, we went to her parents. It was not an easy conversation, their Islamic background played a major role. Finally, they agreed that their daughter could go to a Christian conference, and we were able to find a sponsor for her participation. Merla was this year at *Barnabas Albania* conference. After Merla came back, she started children's services in the community centre and took a leading place in the Summer camps. **Merla was a Muslim -- she now leads the children's ministry in the church! This is what God is doing through the Barnabas conferences! Please help us today in this vital work!**
